Chairmans Report

This is our first year of only Offshore events with races to and from the venues. No Inshore. NECRA has always been about passage races between clubs. We still encourage our members to join with the clubs at their Regattas but it doesn't figure in our race results anymore.

We are trying to take advantage of club events and get 2 distance races in a weekend by including the return trip as a race as well as taking part in the hospitality offered by the host club. In most cases the format worked well with memorable visits to Scarborough, Whitby, the Tyne and Blyth.

2024 membership - 7 RNYC, 11 ScYC, 10 SYC, 16 THYC, 12 WYC - 56 total 2023 membership - 0 RNYC, 8 ScYC, 14 SYC, 25 THYC, 9 WYC - 56 total.

Of the 9 Offshore events we had boats on every event a total of 69 boats overall and of the 7 return events 3 had no entrants, the other 4 had a total of 25 boats taking part.

The 4 major events are Scarborough to Whitby, Sunderland to Whitby, Sunderland to Hartlepool and Hartlepool to Tyne were all well attended

The weather obviously played a significant part in the programme with dense fog on the way to Blyth, glorious sun and wind on the Vernon Dawson and the return races from Whitby, with strong northerly winds back from the Tyne.

We need to work on coordinating our races with club events, bringing THYC and SYC more into our hospitality plans, bringing the furthest clubs into our programme more but our main goal is to encourage more boats to take part.

Overall it has been a moderately successful year with some excellent racing and visits to more clubs. We hope you enjoyed the programme and have some useful suggestions to make during the open meeting later.

Treasurers Report

Dave Addison presented a brief statement of the accounts.

The membership income of £1020.00 was almost matched by expenditure over the season. There is still remaining stock of NECRA hats, shirts and mugs which will be carried over to next season.

The opening balance was £2489.10 and the closing balance was £2213.57. The discrepancy was largely due to some outstanding payments. Some members may be joining in the mistaken belief that they need to be members to compete in the THYC winter series. Membership could fall.

In the absence of nominations, the current Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary agree to continue in post. There is a vacancy for a Vice Chairman and representatives from Scarborough and Blyth.

Open Meeting 8.30

Club Regattas

JA – disappointed that NECRA were no longer incorporating club regattas in their programme. He recognised the need to support each others events. At WYC 2024 regatta there was food and entertainment from the Friday.

SM – there was poor advertising in the lead up to that event. People were not aware of socials at club.

AC – if you're going to race in club regattas there is a need to take part in all races or it skews the results. Scarborough and RNYC are fortunate that they have enough club boats to make a good event. It would be possible to make the THYC regatta a 1 day event.

JH – last year when he left RNYC to come home on the Sunday he felt guilty leaving before the end but the Sunday race was a long distance and they needed to get home. RNYC did a great social evening and were very welcoming.

AH – if NECRA go back to regatta events it would need a much greater commitment from crew.

JC – If the regatta had a short Sunday race it would be feasible to do.

SM – would SYC be prepared to do a 1 day event – NO

SM – would clubs be prepared to do a shorter race on the Sunday with the NECRA return race starting after 12:00 – YES

AC – this the opinion of those in attendance tonight. What about rest of membership.

SM – my thoughts would be to do a feeder race to every regatta and create an additional Feeder Series with a Return race after the Sunday race. It would give an incentive to get boats to the event to take part in the social and then being position to take part in the racing. If the clubs would restrict the length of Sunday morning races to allow boats to get home

starting the NECRA Return 12ish. We should decide on a way forward and then questionnaire the membership about our proposal.

IL – a draft programme will be prepared and we'll then seek the opinions of the clubs.

YTC

CJ – is NECRA going to go with YTC rating system?

SM – at this moment in time we have no plans to change. ScYC is the only one to take it on but also use IRC and THYC are going to trial it in 2025. NECRA can only use it when the majority of clubs are using it. We already sail with ScYC and are able to extrapolate results easily as long as we all sail the same course with the same start. It is relatively easy to give a temporary YTC or NERR rating for visiting boats.

DW – SYC have done comparisons on all their 2024 races and there are certain boats that have a significant difference to NERR although 2024 is much better than 2023. If it continues to improve it's probable that most clubs will take it on eventually.

Merchandise

SM – is there any other merchandise that members would like to see available?

JH – if we had a burgee we could advertise our membership of NECRA.

JA – members should get a burgee as part of membership.

SM – the burgees would need to be better quality than the small year flags which fade quickly which would make them more expensive. I do plan to order some to sell.

AH – can you get shirt sizes not in stock?

SM – I can get shirts relatively easily but small quantities are more expensive. Current shirts are of good quality and the base colour blue is our brand colour.

Website

SM - Larry Wilkinson is stepping back from the maintenance of the website at the end of the year and Ian Maychell is stepping in to run it with Larry providing assistance when necessary.

DW – Larry has been involved with NECRA from 2 years after it's creation in 1964 - 58 years of continuous service.

IL – Larry has been the backbone of NECRA and it probably wouldn't have survived without him. It's an amazing record of achievement.

SM – we must think of something to honour this record

DW – whatever that is still wouldn't be enough. I suggest we collate as many things as we can and then debate.
